Speaker: Rebecca Gillis, Manager of Global Business Development for the

Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade

Rebecca Gillis works on business recruitment, retention, and expansion for Governor Hickenlooper's Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT). She will give a brief introduction of the functions of OEDIT, the agency's efforts to catalyze economic vibrancy throughout the state, and OEDIT's strategies to assist local Colorado businesses expand internationally. Rebecca can also speak to the overall atmosphere in business development in the Metro Denver area, as well as across the rest of the state. Finally, Rebecca can address the growth of specific industries across the region, as well as the Governor's efforts in addressing some of the challenges related to economic development facing the state.

Rebecca Gillis works on domestic and international business recruitment, expansion, and retention for her home state of Colorado. Her industry focuses include outdoor recreation, cybersecurity, aerospace, and advanced manufacturing. Before joining OE-DIT, Rebecca was with Colorado Lending Source, a community development non-profit emphasizing sustainable small business growth throughout the state. She has always had an interest in public service and economic development and has held positions at the Colorado State House of Representatives and with Mile High Youth Corps in the past. In addition, she has worked at a think tank in Washington, D.C., and at an academic institution in Bologna, Italy.

In 2014, Rebecca earned her MA from Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) in International Relations and International Economics. Before studying at SAIS, she graduated from the Metropolitan State University of Denver with a BA in Political Science and a concentration in International Comparative Politics. She is a Colorado native who enjoys trail running, camping, and reading.
